Jack Ward, Jr. of Germantown, TN died early in the morning on Tuesday, June 11th in the company of his two sons, Philip and Curtis Ward. He had been battling cancer with dignity and strength since 2003. Jack was a Vietnam Veteran having served in the Army as helicopter machinist. He was a graduate of the University of Michigan and worked as a controller for International Paper for 34 years. His work took him and his family to New York, California and, finally, to Memphis where he and Elsie (deceased), his wife of 52 years remained. After his retirement from International Paper, he worked with Elsie as a real estate agent for Cyre-Leike until his full retirement in 2011.
