Patsy Jane Brown, beloved wife of Kent “Ken” Brown, passed away on January 17, 2018, at the age of 74, while at West Marion Community Hospital, Ocala, Florida, after a difficult battle with cancer. She was born in Tyronza, Arkansas on October 25, 1943. She lived in Memphis, Tennessee, where she met Ken on a blind lunch date accompanied with Ken’s co-worker. It was love at first sight.
