**H**enry A. Ramsay died from liver failure and cancer at 71 years of age. He was a resident of the Brookdale Germantown Assisted Living facility in Germantown, TN. Henry leaves three adult children, Douglas Huey, Leslie Bell, and Mark Ramsay; a brother, Robert Ramsay of Little Rock; a sister, Susan Whitehead of Memphis; and six grandchildren. Henry was preceded in death by wife, Carolyn Key Ramsay. Henry was a Navy veteran and retiree of the Post Office. During the 1980's, Henry was also known as "Dr. Know", on a sports radio station. As Dr. Know, radio listeners were invited to call in and try to stump Dr. Know with various bits of sports trivia.
