Gayden Drew IV, 60, died Saturday, June 8th at Methodist University Hospital. He is survived by his mother, Bettye Lee Drew of Memphis. Two sons, Gayden Drew of Nashville and Logan Drew of Chattanooga. He also leaves two brothers, Lee Drew and Gregg Drew both of Memphis. Mr. Drew was a graduate of Memphis University School, graduated with honors from University of Tennessee where he was a member of SAE Fraternity, a graduate of University of Memphis Law School and University of Missouri Law School where he specialized in mediation and consultation. He practiced law in Jackson, TN where he was President of Jackson Law Association. He was on the Board of Directors of the Jackson Country Club and was President of the Jackson YMCA.
