Kenneth H. Price “Ken”, age 54, died suddenly on Wednesday evening, February, 13, 2013, while at his parents’ house. He and his sister were caring for their mother who had recently been ill. Ken Price was born January 21, 1959, in Chatom, Alabama where he lived until he was three years old. Ken would eventually become a lifelong area resident of Memphis, TN and lived in Olive Branch at the time of his death. Ken worked for twenty seven years as a Director and Producer for Time warner Cable & Comcast. Ken loved his job working Local area shows, football games, Western Festival and Memphis Tennis tournaments. Ken also loved traveling with his family all over the world but Disney World would always be his favorite vacation spot. While Ken never married he was an avid family man who loved spending time with his mother, father, sister, two nephews, five great nephew’s and two great nieces.
