James Lloyd Embry, 59, passed away at his mother's home on August 17, 2012, surrounded by his family. He is survived by his wife of 33 years, Jennifer Lovett Embry, son Jeffrey Logan Embry, mother Charlena Embry, brother Mike Embry, mother-in-law Freda Lovett, sister and brother in-laws Kathy and Bill Nelson and numerous other family members.
