Helen Gowen Rosebrough, 88, died on January 20, 2011 in Memphis following a brief illness. She was a native and lifelong resident of Memphis. Born on January 28, 1922, she attended the Campus School, Messick High School and the University of Tennessee School of Dentistry. She worked from 1942 until 1975 as a Dental Hygienist.
