ALBERT A. COOK, 89, retired master plumber, born March 8, 1921 in Memphis, died January 11, 2011 at Methodist LeBonheur Germantown Hospital. The family will receive friends from 5-8 p.m., Friday, January 14, and Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m., Saturday, January 15, all at Memorial Park Funeral Home.
