Martha Clayton McLaughlin, 82, beloved wife, mother, grandmother and sister passed away December 28, 2020.

A private graveside service for the family will be held at Memorial Park Cemetery.

Martha was born in Memphis TN on December 18, 1938 to Hubert F and Loraine B Clayton. She graduated from Tiptonville High School as Valedictorian in 1957 and graduated with honors from Murray State University in 1961 with a degree in elementary education.

After teaching at Richland Elementary in Memphis for one year, she married her love, Bill McLaughlin in 1962 and move to Chattanooga TN to join him. She taught school there for ten years. In 1972 she and Bill moved back to Memphis where she taught in Memphis and Shelby County School systems for more than fifteen years.
