He was raised in the Memphis area, attending Southaven High School and briefly attended Memphis State University before taking on the world of real estate.

Kevin was a significant developer who started out as a home builder in the 80’s and went on to reshape much of the Memphis area, eventually moving to Nashville and continuing his work there and around the mid-south. As a close friend put it, “Kevin loved the art of the deal.”
