After a year with Mid-South, Mike accepted a job at W and W Construction Company as an apprentice. W and W changed it's name to HASCO, Inc in the mid 80's. Quickly mastering all aspects of the construction business, he bought the company in January 1992, and ran it as a successful general contracting business until 2018.

Mike was a devoted husband, father and grandfather. As a member of Second Baptist since 1981m he was always involved with his girl's church softball and basketball teams serving as coach for many years.

Because of his love of building and construction, he was a true handyman. He always got so much satisfaction from attending games and tournaments since the 70's. He also followed his beloved Chicago Cubs. We had many family trips to watch them play in St. Louis and at Wrigley. Hw was in heaven on those trips. When they won the World Series, he was on top of the moon.
