Harold Lee McDonald, 76, of Bartlett, Tennessee, passed away peacefully on October 11, 2024. Born on November 21, 1947, to Roy A. McDonald, Sr. and Elzora McDonald in Memphis, TN. Harold was the youngest of five children. He was preceded in death by his siblings Roy Jr., Joyce, William, and Ronald.

Harold graduated from Humes High School in 1965 and went on to earn his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Christian Brothers University. His career in the railroad industry spanned over 40 years, where he worked as a Yard Master and Switchman for CSX (formerly L&N Railroad). Dedicated and hardworking, Harold also served as a union representative, always advocating for his fellow workers. 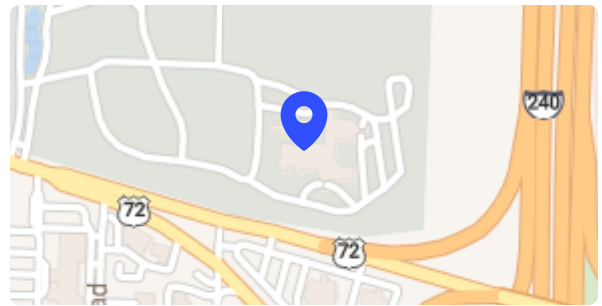

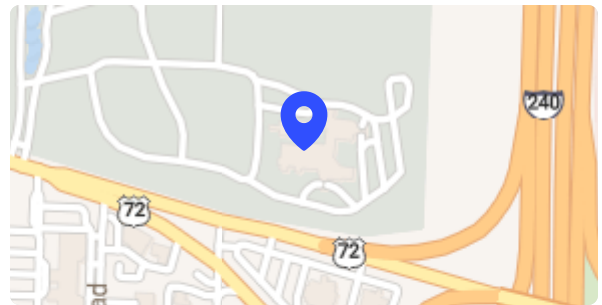

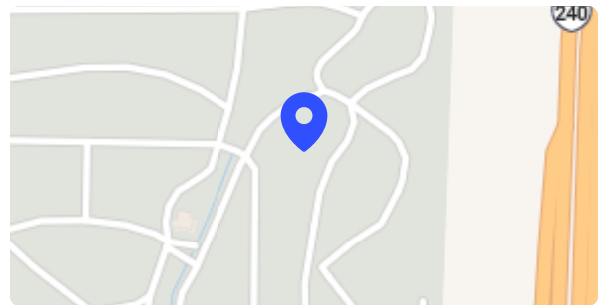
