**L**uther Banks Huffman, lovingly known as Butch, passed away on May 24, 2025, at Methodist Hospital in Olive Branch, Mississippi. Born on November 27, 1943, in Memphis, Tennessee, Butch lived a life full of love, laughter, and devotion to his family and friends.

Butch's heart has always been for his family, his wife and children and his extended family. Butch lost his father when he was just a young child. This loss brought on a lot of responsibility that he carried throughout his life and brought him closer to his younger brother, mother, his aunts and uncles and then eventually his in-laws. These relationships lasted a lifetime.

Butch met his future wife Cheryl, on a blind date set up by a relative.
