Sherry Lee Casteel, born April 25, 1950, a native of Memphis, Tn, passed away peacefully at the age of 75 in Ft. Lauderdale Fl, where she enjoyed the last 25 years of her life.

Sherry was preceded in death by her father, George Casteel, Mother, Katherine Green, and sister, Jan Johnson.

She is survived by her loving husband, Dick Berry, of 31 years, and 2 brothers, Keith Casteel (68), and David Hodges (66). In addition, she leaves behind 2 nieces, 3 nephews, 2 great nieces, and 4 great nephews.

Sherry attended and graduated from Memphis State University, earning a degree in Psychology. Soon after, she entered the workforce specializing in stocks, trades, and loans. In 1988, Sherry made the self-less decision to forego her career to become a full-time caregiver to her brother, David, who suffered a traumatic brain injury at the age of 30.

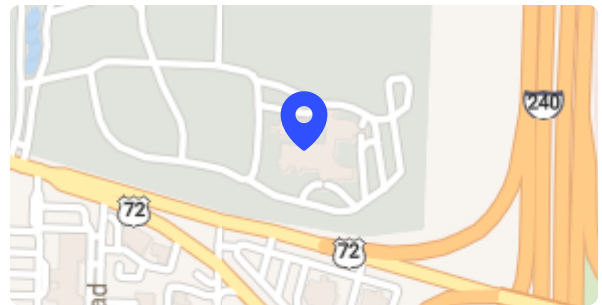
