Everette Milton Hatcher, a devoted husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather, passed away peacefully in Memphis, Tennessee, on February 22, 2026, following a courageous journey with Alzheimer's disease. He was 86 years old.

A lifelong resident of Memphis, Everette's life was defined by his unwavering faith in God and his profound love for his family. He was a pillar of Bellevue Baptist Church, where he worshiped for over 50 years and served on the finance committee. His commitment to Christian leadership extended into the community, where he served on the board of Evangelical Christian School (ECS).

Everette was a proud graduate of Columbia Military Academy and earned both his undergraduate degree and MBA from Memphis State.

In his 65 years of marriage to his beloved wife, Jane, Everette built a legacy of joy and togetherness. Sunday afternoons were the heartbeat of the Hatcher family—filled with Jane's cooking, football, Capture the Flag, go-karts, and horses. These traditions, along with annual family beach trips, created a lifetime of memories for his children, 14 grandchildren, and 18 great-grandchildren.

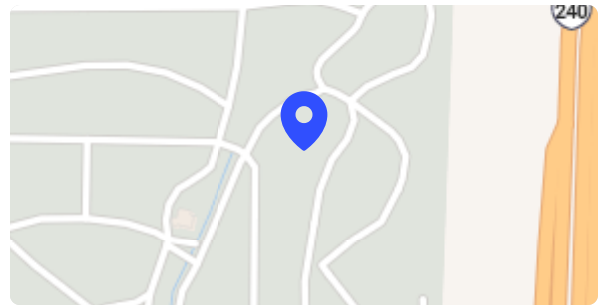
